

## Forest Hill Cemetery Regulations

1. All monuments and markers shall be placed in line with other markers in that row. Placement of markers, permanent memorials and monuments shall be under the direct supervision of the Cemetery Sexton. Only six (6) urns allowed per plot.
2. Only one (1) marker is allowed per grave site, except a ground level military service marker may be placed in addition to a grave marker
3. No perennial plants, shrubs or trees shall be planted on any grave in any part of the cemetery
4. All memorials placed on NEW burials shall be removed after Fourteen (14) days or will be disposed of by City personnel
5. No food products, personal effects, household products or other non-traditional cemetery ornamental items are allowed to be placed in any part of the cemetery
6. Flowers and decorations may be placed during May through September those placed at ground level must be removed by June 15<sup>th</sup> each year. Because of the lawn care, planting of flowers is only permitted in designated urns or hanging pots elevated to one (1) stand per grave which can stay through September. Any permitted urn or hanging pot must be placed in line with all monuments and markers.
7. No mound or foot stone shall be raised upon any grave above the general level of the lot.
8. No hedges, fences or enclosures of any kind will be permitted on or around lots. Wooden boxes, wire containers, glass jars, bottles, toys, cans and other such objects may not be placed on lots and, if so placed, will be removed by the City without notice.
9. All artificial flowers displayed in the cemetery must be in containers and placed at the head of the grave lot. Any artificial flowers not in containers will be removed from the cemetery by the Sexton. Nothing will be allowed directly in front or behind the monument that interferes with lawn care operations.
10. Wreaths on wire stands must also be placed at the head of the lot, in line with Monuments. Nothing will be allowed directly in front or behind the monument that interferes with lawn care operations.
